Leaving Victoria with 5 white men, they picked up a crew of West Coast Indian hunters and proceeded south to meet the seals. Off the mouth of the Columbia River the schooner encountered a heavy southwesterly wind and during the height of the gale a sea broke under her, turning her completely over.

Fortunately for the men aboard a following great wave threw the ship back again on an even keel, with masts gone and the hull nearly full of water. Only one man was lost, but Hallgren and Gullen lost all their belongings and their schooner. Several days later they were rescued by a steamer bound from San Francisco for Victoria and landed here.

When the sealing became a thing of the past, Hallgren found employment in various capacities along the waterfront and was much sought after when exacting jobs peculiar to the seafaring profession were required done in shipshape fashion. ROBP

At age 13, Jordan shipped aboard the sealing schooner Ocean Belle for a passage to Victoria by way of Cape Horn to join his uncles - Captains JG William and Clarence Cox, who in the heyday of sealing operated schooners out of Victoria. Until he was 20 he spent 9 months of each year serving in various capacities aboard sealing schooners.

In the late 1890s he abandoned the sealing game and joined SS Danube as 2<sup>nd</sup> officer. Danube was at that time running between Victoria, Skagway and St. Michaels. Subsequently he quit salt water for the Arrow Lakes, where he was master of a small passenger vessel until the Klondike call became too strong. He went north to prospect, cut cordwood, guide the Mounties and serve aboard river boats until 1907, when he left the Yukon for employment with HBC and Foley, Welch & Stewart sternwheelers on the Stikine and Skeena Rivers, after which he rejoined Canadian Pacific and served on a number of its coastwide steamers.

In 1915 he went overseas as a commissioned officer with the 1<sup>st</sup> Pioneers. He served in France for a year and was wounded at Ypres. While in hospital he was asked to transfer to the Inland Water Transport [IWT]. Ready to do so, his OC demurred and he was returned to France, but shortly afterwards the transfer was arranged by the Royal Engineers. For several months he instructed IWT officers in military drill. Later he was chief officer on river steamers in Mesopotamia and subsequently became master of a hospital ship operating between Bagdad and Amara.

Jordan, invalided by a heat stroke while in command of the hospital ship, was sent to the Indian hill country to recuperate, later going in to Bangalore in charge of works. He remained in India until the spring of 1919.

Returning to Victoria he served again aboard CPR vessels as chief officer and master until he joined the Vancouver Pilots' Assn, which was later absorbed under the Canadian Pilot Authority.

Approaching his retirement, he is looking forward to many happy days enjoying his favourite pastime - angling. His many friends hope he will enjoy his future and that the days to come will always provide good fishing. [died April 26, 1963, Victoria. Cremate]

'In 1891 when the sealing was at its best, there were many fine schooners engaged in hunting the fur. Two of the finest were the big two-topmast schooners Annie C Moore and Carmolite, both owned by late Captain Charles Hackett, a newcomer in the business who raised the price of seal skins to the hunter from \$1.50 to \$3.25 per seal, which meant he got the pick hunters for his vessels along with Joe Adolphus, Billy Poirier and Andrew Davidson, I shipped on Carmolite, and after hunting the Washington-BC coast sailed into Allitck Bay in Kodiak Island, where we were to meet Danube, which had been chartered by the sealing schooner owners to take stores to the schooners and bring the spring catch of skins to Victoria.

About 30 schooners were anchored there. Danube was anchored 3 miles offshore, outside the limit. We put our furs aboard her, but found she had no stores for Carmolite, so we had to go to Sand Point, where we learned that the schooners there had been warned not to enter Bering Sea and were getting ready to go home. As we had not been able to get into Sand Point for lack of wind, Captain Cutler, myself and another man went ashore in one of our ship's boats unnoticed by the US Coast Guard. Several warships were in the vicinity, we learned, and Cutler sent me back to the ship with orders for the mate to take the schooner 6 miles away and stay there until further orders.

'That night USS Thetis passed close by, but did not stop us and several days later Cutler returned to our ship aboard Annie E Paint, bringing stores for Carmolite with him. Transferring the stores at sea, Paint headed for Victoria, having been warned, while Carmolite was to try and run the blockade of British and American warships, which we knew would be on the lookout for any schooner heading for the Bering. We sailed far out in the Pacific in a strong gale of wind and turning north ran through 72 Pass on July 4, figuring the warships would be in port for the holiday. We met with no warships and several days later hove-to 100 miles south of St Paul's Island, were we found the weather fine and seals plentiful. We took a few over 1,600 skins in 16 days hunting. This was too good to last, and on the 17<sup>th</sup> day HMS Nymphe, from Esquimalt, came along and her boarding officer told us to stop hunting and go home. He also told us he had sent Annie C Moore home the night before.

'Stopping the hunting cost everybody money, we all put in claims for losses, but nothing ever came of that. Carmolite was seized by the Russians the next year.'
